



Each of the three Ajyal Juries awards a Best Film prize to their favourite short and feature-length films, for a total of six awards. The directors of the winning films are granted funding toward their next film, so jurors are empowered to support and promote future content that is relevant and important to them, in a proactive way.

are aged 18 to 21 and will select their

favourite films from five features and

one programme of short films.

It Must Be Heaven 18 Doha Film Institute Supported Film



Award-winning Palestinian auteur Elia Suleiman masterfully uses his penetrating gaze and expressive body language to distil the soul of Palestine, and nowhere is this more evident than in his new surreal comedy 'It Must Be Heaven'. Leaving his homeland for the bustling metropolises of Paris and New York, Suleiman turns his signature observational style from Palestine to a broader world, full of comparable tension, absurdity and paranoia. In each new city, Suleiman is wide-eyed with curiosity and wonder at the daily lives of the respective inhabitants, yet time and again, something always seems to remind him of home.

Speaking just four words in the entire film, Suleiman has an almost effortless ability to convey so much meaning in his facial expressions, and the film brings an abundance of the sadly-forgotten art of silent comedy roaring into the 21st century. Winner of the Jury Special Mention and FIPRESCI Critics' Award at this year's Cannes Film Festival, and Palestine's entry for Best International Feature Film at the 92nd Academy Awards—'It Must Be Heaven' is a comic saga exploring identity, nationality and belonging, in which Suleiman asks the fundamental question: where is the place we can truly call home? As the academic year draws to a close in the mountains of Lebanon, eleven-year-old Wissam struggles to pluck up the courage to reveal his true feelings to classmate Joanna. But before he can, and with his school in the midst of their final exams, the air invasions on Beirut begin, and the pupils are to be sent home. However, the imminent danger only makes Wissam even more resolute, as it becomes clear that no one knows what tomorrow will bring.

Winner of the NETPAC Award for World or International Asian Film Premiere at the Toronto International Film Festival 2019 Director: **Oualid Mouaness** Lebanon, USA, Norway, Qatar / Arabic, English / 2019 / 100 mins

Ailo, a reindeer born just a little prematurely, spends the first year of his life on a long, arduous journey across Lapland. An uplifting and heartwarming story from the bleak and cold wilderness, the camera follows Ailo and his mother on their incredible adventure through the white frozen expanses of the polar circle. Throughout his odyssey, the frail and vulnerable newborn reindeer must overcome incredible obstacles that stand in the way of his first migration.

Torarin and Svalin live way up in Arctic Norway. Initially wanting horses to ride, they quickly get over their disappointment when their father buys them two Bactrian camels instead. The plan is to train them and build a camel centre—but camels are stubborn animals, and teaching them is certainly not a job for an amateur. So, the family pack their bags and head on an expedition to Mongolia, hoping to find a professional who will help train their animals in Norway.

A fairytale-like adventure in which a young boy finds himself pursued by a malevolent creature across a mysterious land, crossing barren deserts and lush forests. With animals as his only companions, our hero must race to safety amid his beautiful yet strange surroundings. The film abstains from dialogue to create a vibrant and satisfying world full of both unspoken dread and wonder. A labour of love, 'Away', was written, produced, directed, and composed entirely by Gints Zilbalodis.

Young Kamala makes flower garlands to sell on the streets of Bombay during the day, and at night works as a "dancer". Desperately wishing to keep her little sister Tara away from the harsh life she leads, she uses her meagre earnings and those of her watchmaker grandfather to pay for school for the young girl. A chance encounter with Salim, the boy from across the street, offers hope of a better life for Kamala who now must choose between fending for her family and finding true love.

On the first day of summer vacation, young Ruka befriends two brothers, Umi and Sora, at her father's aquarium. The boys were raised in the ocean, which has given them an incredible ability to swim like fish and communicate with sea creatures. She forms a natural affinity with the brothers, and together they notice a strange call from the deep that's luring all types of marine life away from their natural habitats. A mystery in which the three children seem destined to play a crucial role.

In this darkly-comedic, yet uplifting tale, Chinese-born, American-raised Billi (Awkwafina) finds out that her "Nai-Nai" has tragically been diagnosed with lung cancer. Although the whole family knows their beloved matriarch is terminally ill, everyone has decided not to tell Nai Nai herself. To spend her final moments together, they gather under the joyful guise of an expedited wedding, uniting family members scattered around the globe in this poignant drama that marries cultural specificity with universally relatable themes.

Winner of the Audience Favourite Award at the Sundance Film Festival: London 2019 Director: Lulu Wang USA, China / English, Mandarin / 2019 / 98 mins

A love letter from a young mother to her daughter, the film tells the story of Waad al-Kateab's life through five years of the uprising in Aleppo, Syria. We witness her fall in love, get married and give birth to Sama, all while cataclysmic conflict rises around her. Her camera captures incredible stories of loss, laughter and survival as Waad wrestles with an impossible choice—whether or not to flee the city to protect her daughter's life, when leaving means abandoning the struggle for freedom for which she has already sacrificed so much.

Winner of the Golden Eye Documentary Prize at the Cannes Film Festival 2019 Director: **Waad al-Kateab, Edward Watts** Syria, UK / Arabic, English / 2019 / 95 mins

Vic, a hapless young Russian-American, drives a transport bus for the disabled in Milwaukee. He's late today, but it's not his fault. Roads are closed for a protest, and no one else can shuttle his grandfather and a dozen elderly Russians to a funeral. The new route uproots his scheduled clients, particularly Tracy, a vibrant young woman with ALS. As the day goes from hectic to off-the-rails, their collective ride becomes a comical and endearing portrait of American dreams and disenchantment.

When a neighbouring family moves in and tries to do the same, it becomes a source of tension when they disregard her age-old wisdom and advice—making a series of shortsighted decisions that could destroy her way of life forever.

Selva lives in a Caribbean coastal town. After the abrupt disappearance of her only motherly figure, the thirteen-yearold girl is left alone to take care of her elderly grandfather, who doesn't want to live anymore. Between mysterious shadows and wild games, she debates whether or not to help her grandfather achieve his desire, even though this might mean going through her last moments of childhood alone. A tender and humane coming-of-age story, the film plays on the edge between adolescence and maturity, life and death.

A gritty and impassioned portrait of a delivery driver and his family as they struggle to make ends meet in modern-day England. Devastated by the 2008 financial crisis and now unable to save enough for a mortgage, both Ricky and his wife are forced into 'zero-hour' contract work. The couples' jobs are void of any real employment benefits or security and the strain this puts on them is palpable as they attempt to keep their family together on a tight-rope budget.

Ibrahim, Suleiman, Manar and Altayeb are founding members of the 'Sudanese Film Group'. Friends for over four decades, but after years apart due to exile, the quartet of filmmakers are reunited and rekindle their dream of bringing cinema to the masses in their home country of Sudan. From the rubble of their wounded nation's film industry, and using whatever materials are on hand, the four intrepid friends attempt to restore their country's cultural history through the power of film.

Deftly dealing with a series of culture-clashes and misunderstandings, 'To the Ends of the Earth' is an intimate portrait of someone cast into a foreign land and struggling to find their bearings.

Unable to take the ramifications of the prophecy, his father leaves to work in neighbouring Ethiopia. Continuously reminded of his predestined fate growing up, young Muzamel is coddled almost to the point of suffocation by his overprotective mother. Until Suliman, a cinematographer opens a window onto a whole new world for Muzamel, and slowly, he comes to doubt the veracity of the prophecy.
